Supporting Documents Required	1) Completed and signed application form with "Confirmation Sheet" 2) Official Academic Transcript from Home University 3) One International Student Reference Form (2 pages each) 4) Proof of English Proficiency (if applicable) 5) Two ID Photos
GPA Requirement	Applicants must have completed two semesters before applying and have a cumulative GPA (Grade Point Average) of 2.50 (4.0 scale) or higher.
Level of English Proficiency Requirement	Applicants whose first language is NOT English are required to achieve a standard of TOEFL score 500 (PBT) or its equivalent, or IELTS score of 5.0 or equivalent. #### ■ Visa Information

Student Visa Application Procedure	1) Submit the following required supporting documents along with the application documents for AIU admission:  • Copy of Passport • Evidence of Financial Support (Bank Statement or Financial aid/Scholarship certificate)  2) After admission to AIU, each student must submit "Offer Acceptance and Immigration Information Form" online.  3) The Center for International Affairs will submit the application for the CoE to the immigration office in order that admitted students can arrive on AIU campus by our official arrival day.
