Important Instructions To Follow

To be secured well enough against theft, please follow the instructions bellow:

Secure Your Space:

 Always lock your doors and windows when leaving your room or office, even if it's just for a short time. Never prop open doors or windows, and ensure they are always properly secured

Keep Valuables with You:

• Never leave personal items such as mobile phones, purses, wallets, laptops or other valuables unattended in public spaces. If you need to leave your belongings in public, ask a trusted friend to watch them for you

Controlled Access:

■ Do not allow strangers to enter campus and its secured buildings when you are entering or exiting. Avoid letting people come inside right behind you. If you see someone who might be a danger, please contact campus security at 025-86718116 immediately

Public Spaces:

In canteens or other public places, do not hang your bag over the back of a chair or place it out of sight under a table. Always keep your belongings in your sight

Vehicles:

 Always lock your vehicle. Remove items from a bicycle you used. Take all easily unattachable items such as helmet, or any important accessories with you



What To Do If You Are a Victim of Theft?

We understand that experiencing a theft can be distressing. To help mitigate further risks to your personal and financial security, follow these steps:

Report the Theft:

• If you are a victim of theft, promptly report the incident to Nanjing University campus security at 025-86718116 or the local police at 025-110. They are available 24/7 to assist you. Immediate reporting increases the chances of recovering your property and prevents further incidents

Rekey Locks:

• If any physical keys or cards were stolen, inform the relevant authorities or property owner to rekey the locks

Financial Safeguards:

Notify your banks and cancel any stolen credit or debit cards. Request new cards to prevent fraudulent activity

Identification Cards:

 Contact the relevant government departments or embassy in China to replace stolen IDs, such as driver's licenses or passports
